

MARSHAL'S REPORT
November 11TH – December 10TH, 2008

Nov. 2nd, 1038 pm- A suspicious vehicle was investigated by the deputy on duty.

Nov. 18th, 2:52 pm- The Marshal's Office was called to assist DEA agents with the delivery of a package containing over 2 pounds of high grade marijuana that had been mailed to Alta. The recipient was charged with Felony Possession with intent to distribute. A large quantity of cash was also seized. (Hmmm... mail+airplane+homeland security searches+dope. Nov. 20th, 6:30 am- The canyon road was restricted and Interlodge Closure was put into effect for test firing of the avalanche control weapons.
